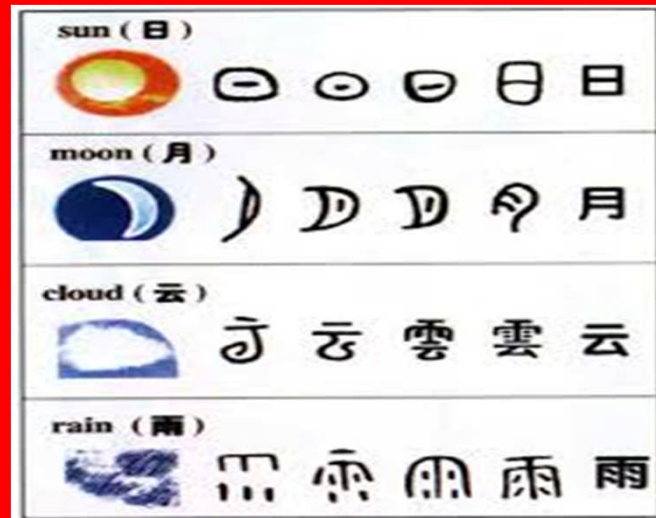




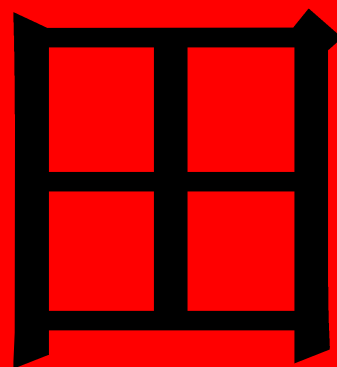
Some Chinese characters were originally pictograms, which means they derive from pictures of the object they denote.



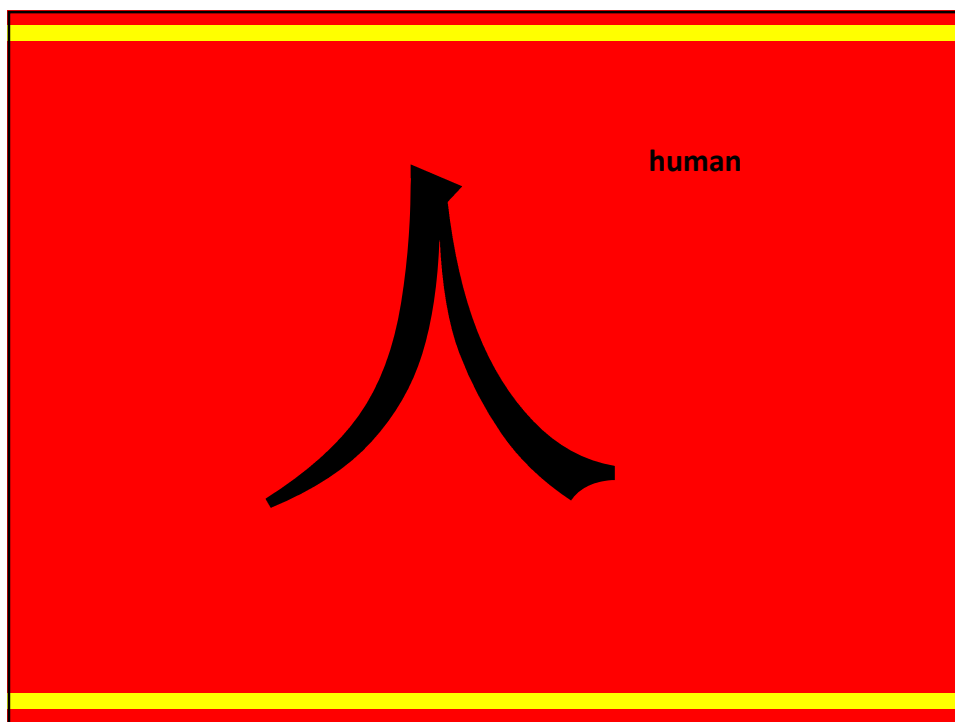
